Just as the peripeteia directly leads to the anagnorisis, the anagnorisis directly leads to the catastrophe, or the terrible suffering. What hooks you? This darkness allows him to reflect on his mistakes and to clear his sins. A further symbol is Oedipus swollen feet and his name. Oedipus accuses Croon of framing him for the murder of Alias so that Croon would become king. It allows the audience to feel a sense of privilege and engagement in the play and develops an alliance between the dramatist and the spectators, so that mere curiosity is not the only aspect keeping the viewers interested.
